Susan was a single mother of two who struggled with addiction for many years. She had been in and out of rehab several times, but she could never seem to stay sober.


One day, Susan came to my office and asked for help. She was tired of living her life in a cycle of addiction and relapse. I referred her to a therapist who specialized in addiction recovery.
