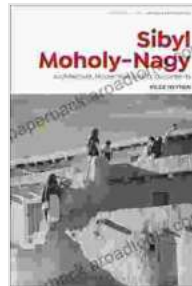

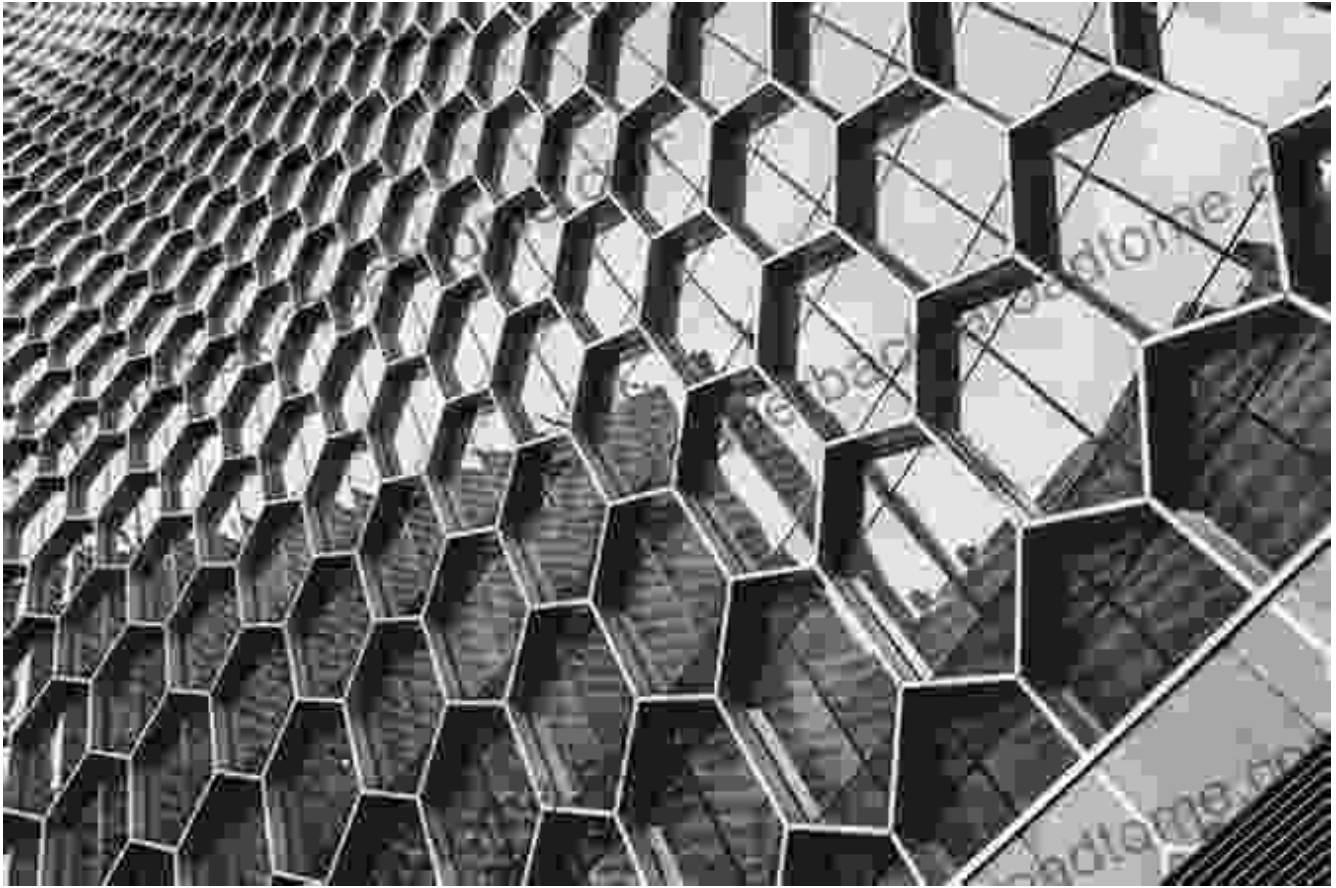

: The Promise and the Failure

Architecture Modernism, with its emphasis on functionality, simplicity, and industrial aesthetics, emerged in the early 20th century as a response to the social and technological transformations of the time. The Urban Dilemma

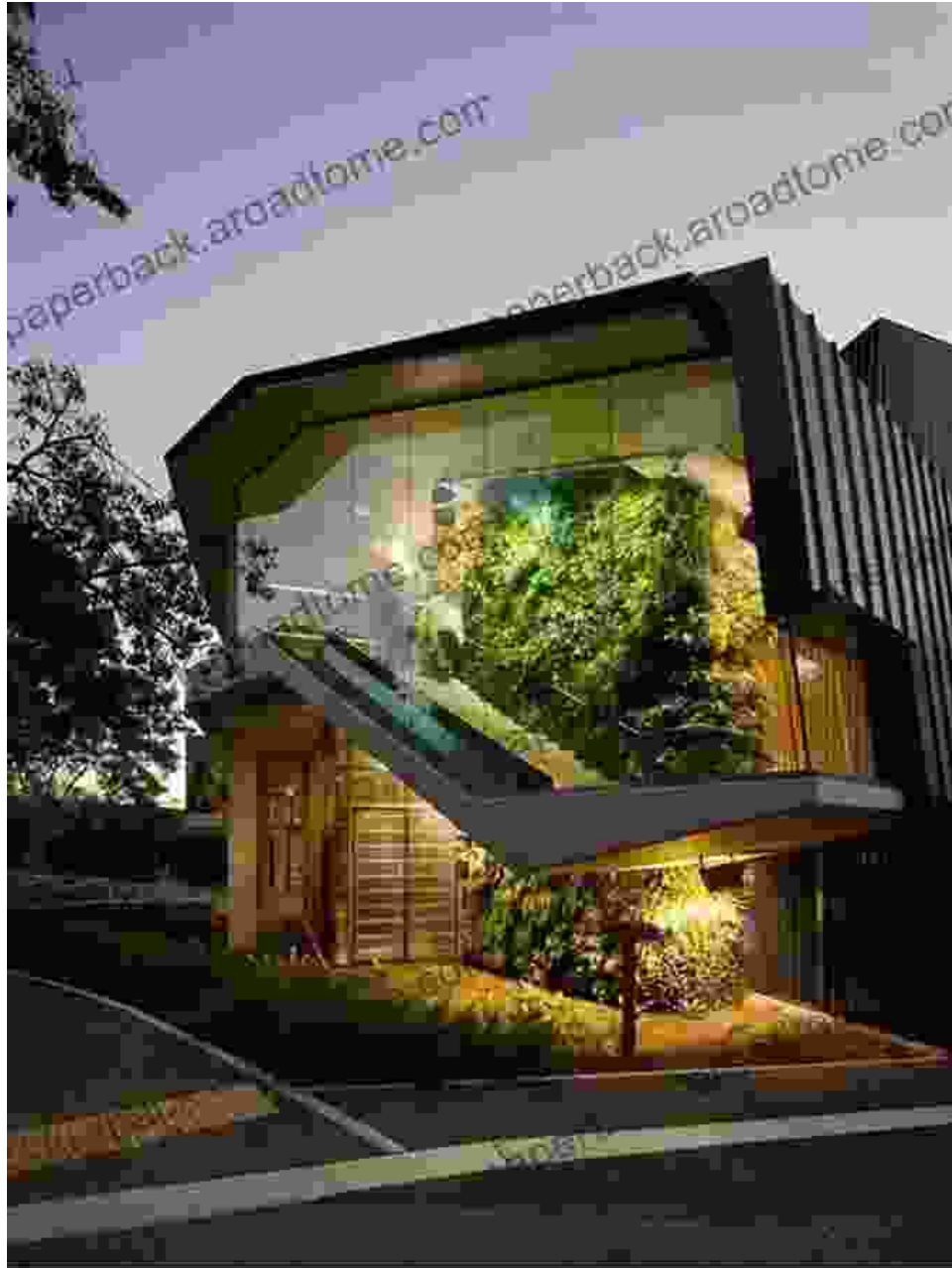
Modernist urban planning prioritized efficiency over human experience. The separation of functions (residential, commercial, industrial) created segregated and impersonal cities that lacked organic connections.

The widespread use of concrete and other energy-intensive materials in modernist architecture has contributed significantly to greenhouse gas emissions and environmental degradation.

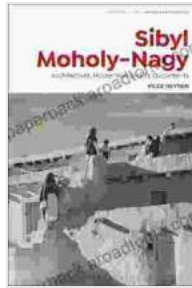
The Current Discourse

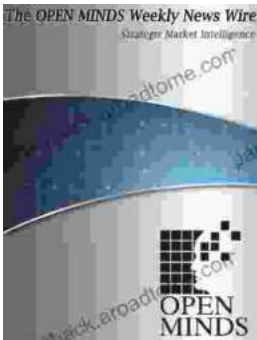
: *Beyond Modernism*
