Forms of German Attributive Adjectives

There are three forms of German attributive adjectives:

- **Strong:** This form is used when the adjective is in the nominative case and precedes a noun that is in the nominative or accusative case.
- **Weak:** This form is used when the adjective is in the genitive, dative, or accusative case and follows a noun that is in the genitive or dative case.

- **Mixed:** This form is used when the adjective is in the genitive or dative case and precedes a noun that is in the nominative or accusative case.

Declension of German Attributive Adjectives

German attributive adjectives are declined according to their gender, number, and case. The following table shows the declension of the adjective "gut" (good):

Case	Singular	Plural
Nominative	guter	gute
Genitive	guten	guter
Dative	gutem	guten
Accusative	guten	gute

Comparison of German Attributive Adjectives

German attributive adjectives can be compared using the following degrees of comparison:

- **Positive:** This is the basic form of the adjective.
- **Comparative:** This form is used to compare two things.
- **Superlative:** This form is used to compare three or more things.

The following table shows the comparison of the adjective "gut" (good):

Degree	Singular	Plural
Positive	gut	gute
Comparative	besser	bessere
Superlative	best	beste


