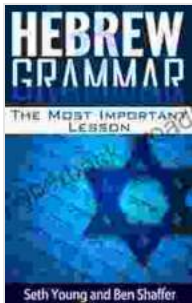

- פ (pe)
- צ (tsade)
- ק (qof)
- ר (resh)

- ש (shin)
- ת (tav)

The Hebrew vowels are:

- א (a)
- ב (e)
- ג (i)
- ד (o)
- ה (u)

Hebrew Consonants

Hebrew consonants are divided into three categories: gutturals, labials, and dentals.

The guttural consonants are:

- א (aleph)
- ה (he)
- ח (het)
- ע (ayin)

The labial consonants are:

- ב (bet)
- ו (vav)

- מ (mem)
- פ (pe)

The dental consonants are:

- ג (gimel)
- ד (dalet)
- ט (tet)
- י (yod)
- כ (kaf)
- ל (lamed)
- נ (nun)
- ס (samekh)
- צ (tsade)
- ק (qof)
- ר (resh)
- ש (shin)
- ת (tav)

Hebrew Vowels

Hebrew vowels are represented by dots and dashes placed above and below the Hebrew consonants.

The dot vowels are:

- א (a)
- א (e)

The dash vowels are:

- א (i)
- א (o)
- א (u)

Basic Hebrew Grammar Rules

Here are some basic Hebrew grammar rules:

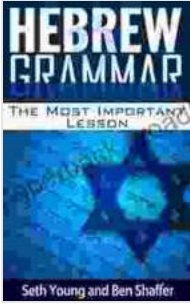
- Hebrew is read from right to left.
- Nouns are either masculine or feminine.
- Adjectives agree with the nouns they modify in gender and number.
- Verbs agree with the subjects they modify in person and number.

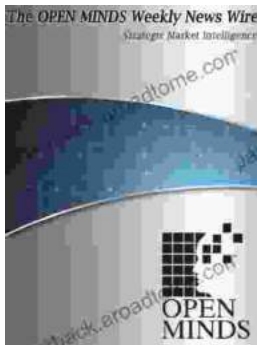
