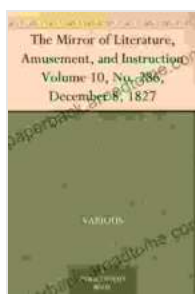

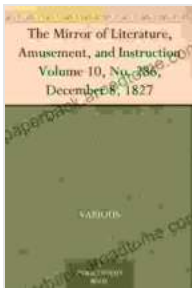
Fashion
