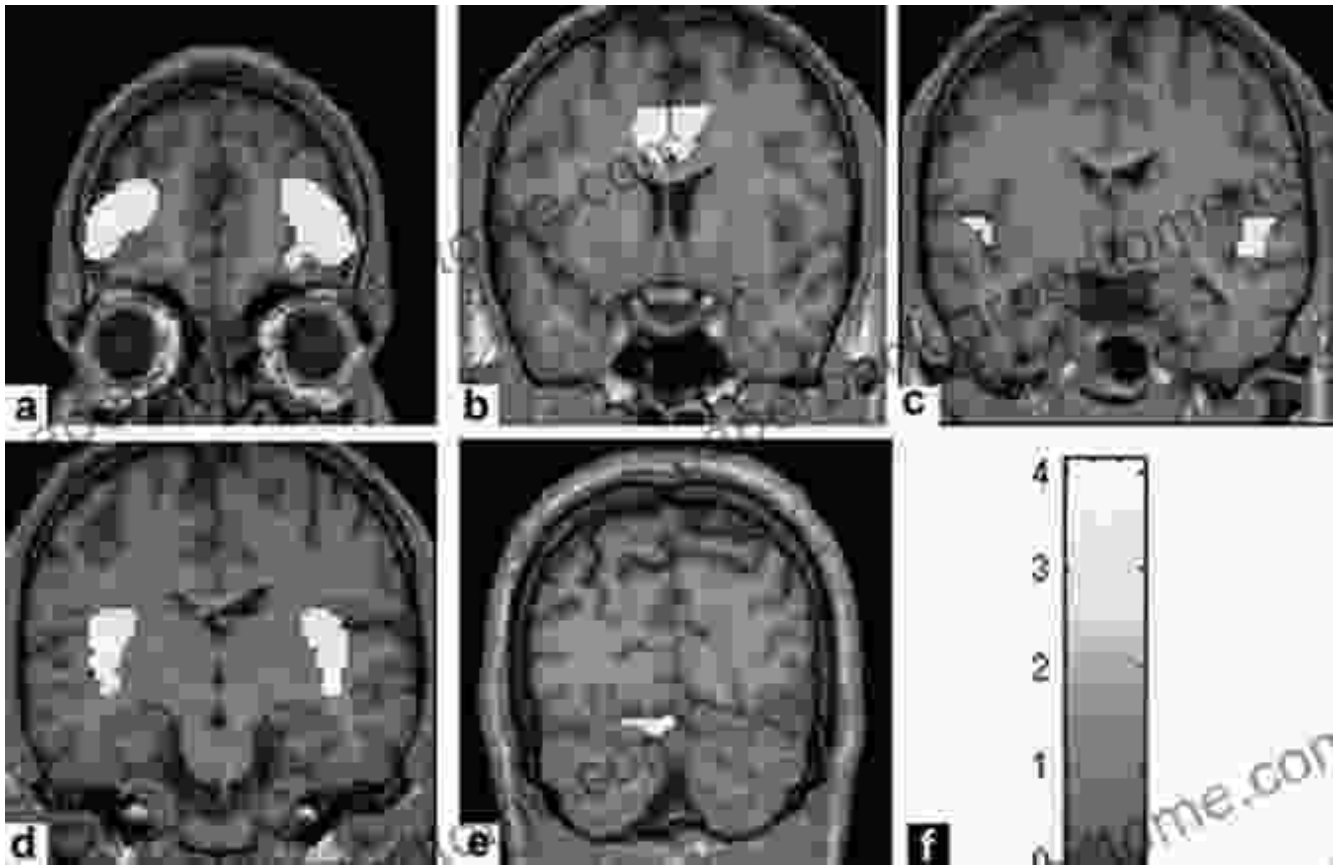

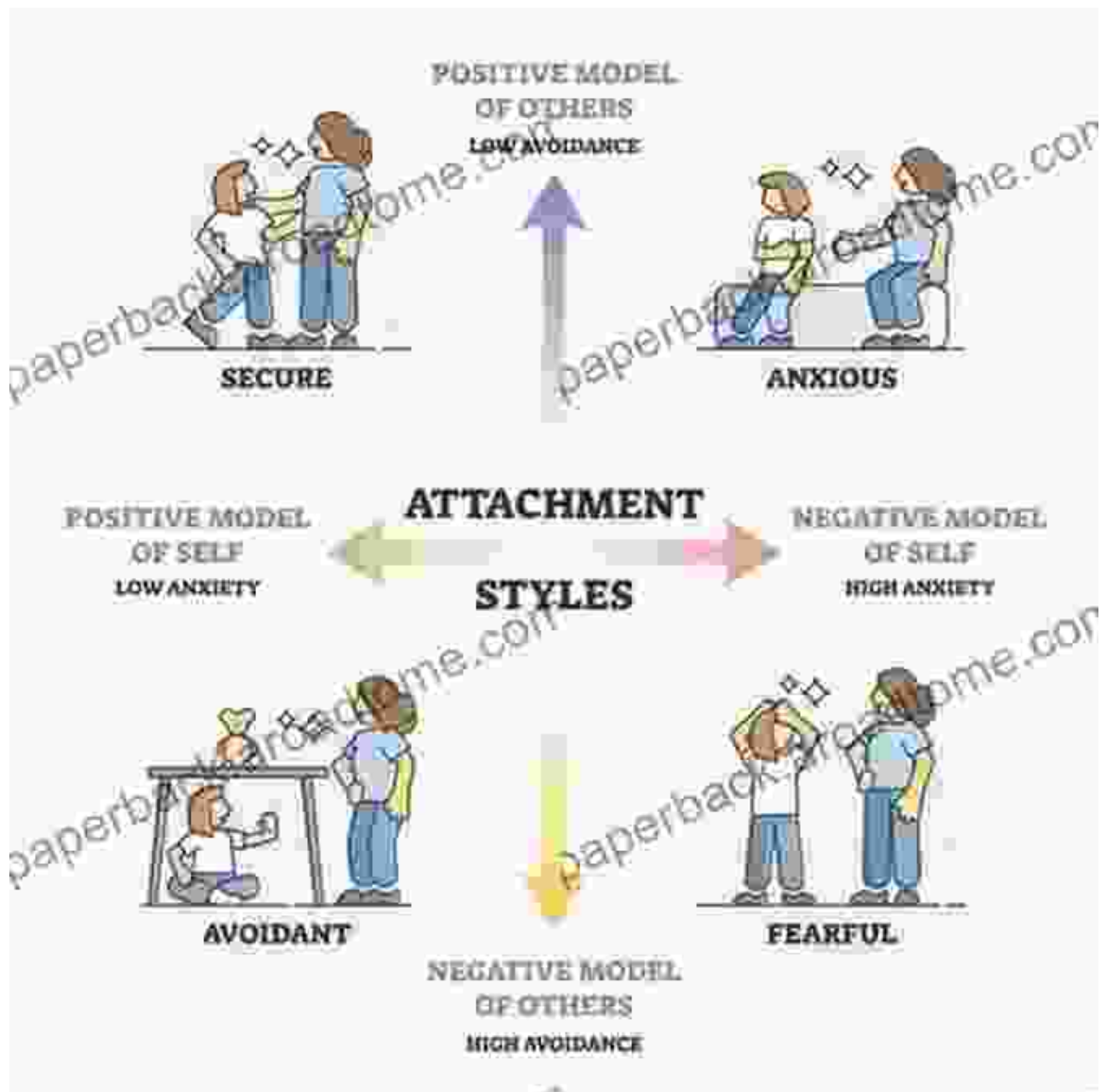
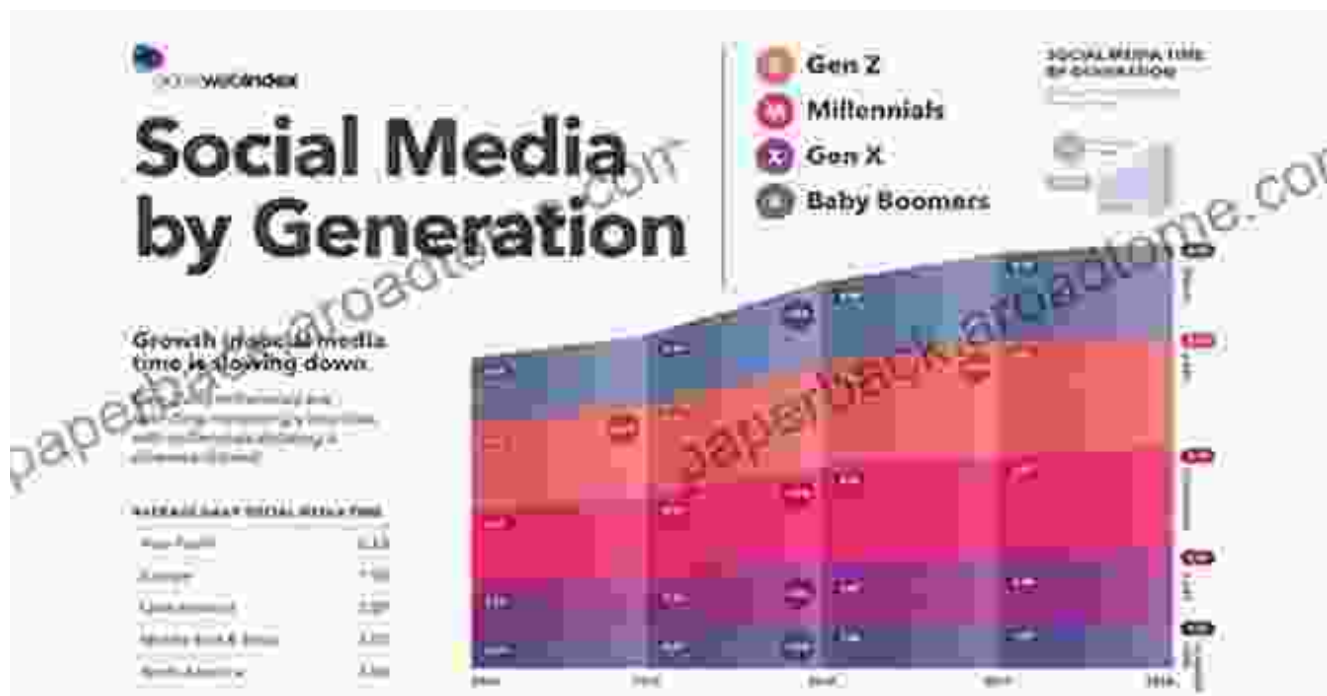


Diagram illustrating the different attachment styles and their potential impact on the development of NPD

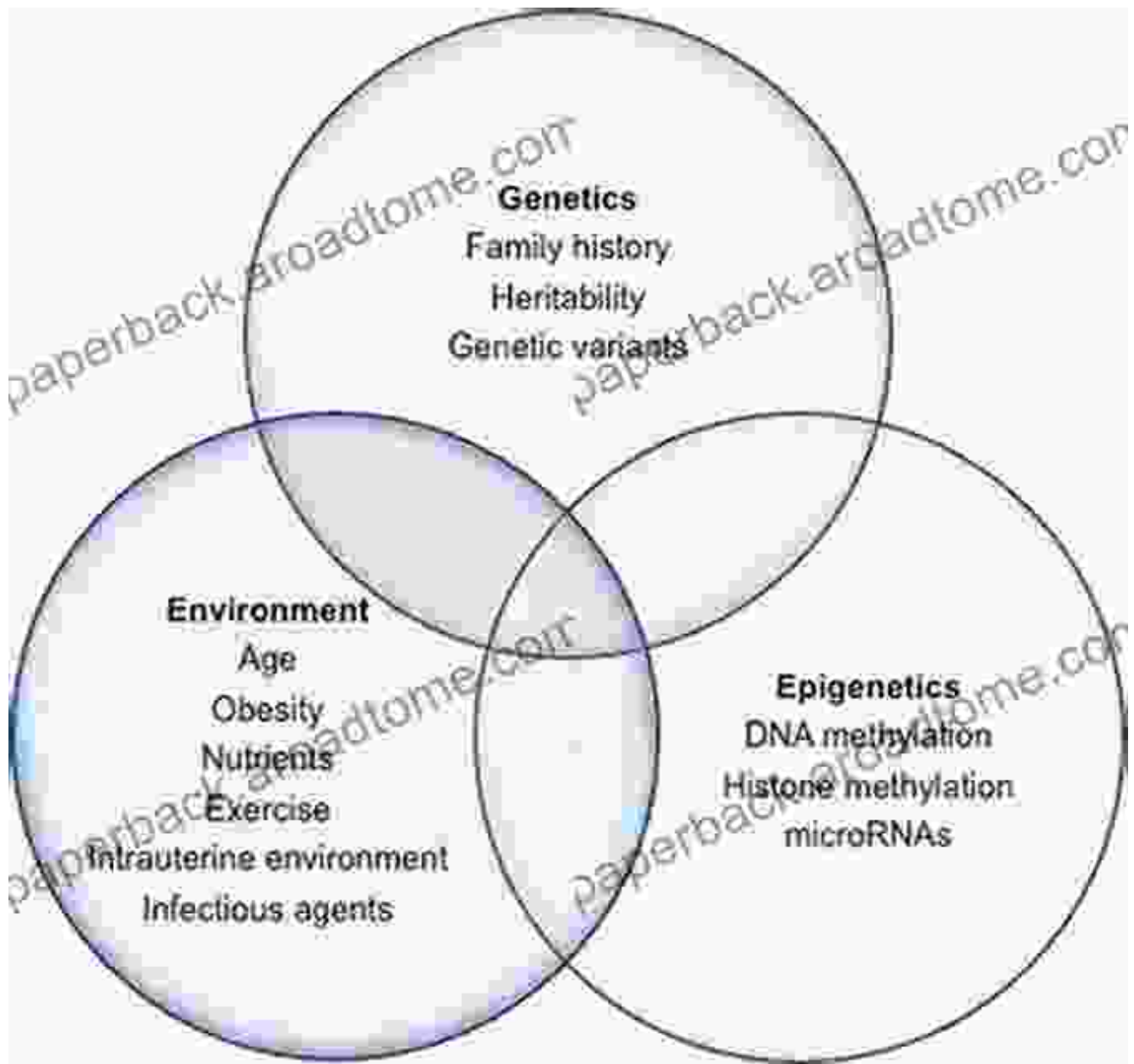


Diagram illustrating the interaction between genetics, epigenetics, and environmental factors in the development of NPD

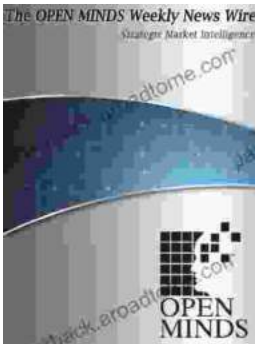
